He accepted, almost in it's entirety, the traditional set of values Bankim broke fresh ground in the field of friction. But his novels cannot describe as modern in spirit. It was Rabindhranath Tagore who wrote for the first time in India, novels and stories which may be described as modern in the true sense of the term. Once again we find this extraordinary man giving a lead in yet another field of culture.
